Oak Court combines 50 one and two bedroom selfcontained apartments for rent, with a range of communal spaces for you to enjoy with other residents and your guests.

There will be staff based on site to support you throughout the day and night. The Extra-Care Manager will deal with any queries you have about your accommodation, housing charges and benefits, as well as the general upkeep of your apartment.

They can also advise about the facilities available at Oak Court and in the local community.

The Extra-Care Manager will support tenants to develop a tenant committee and a programme of social activities.

ON-SITE CARE AND SUPPORT

Extra-care housing is designed to help people with care and support needs to live a full and independent life. The scheme manager is available during the week from 9am - 5pm. Care and support staff cover a 24 hour rota. Additional 1:1 support (based on assessed need) is also available at times to suit.

Oak Court will provide you with a safe, comfortable and accessible home, with your own front door linked to a secure entry system and access to a range of communal facilities, such as lounge and dining area, cinema and landscaped gardens. There are also opportunities to make new friends, take part in hobbies and explore new interests. Residents can choose from a variety of social and leisure activities to maintain active and healthy lifestyles and keeping the mind and body stimulated, regardless of age or ability.

YOUR APARTMENT

Built to a high standard, your apartment is completely self-contained. It has its own secure entrance, kitchen, bathroom, lounge/dining room and one or two bedrooms.

The apartments are spacious and flexible so they can adapt to your changing needs.

Yes, the scheme is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week and accessed by a door entry system and you will have your own key to your apartment.

CAN VISITORS STAY OVERNIGHT?

Yes, your visitors are welcome to stay with you in your apartment or use the guest suite, which is available for a small cost.
